2) PAYMENT

Once your application is reviewed and accepted you will be invoiced for payment. You can pay for your membership by e-transfer or cheque. Once payment has been received you will be eligible to play immediately. All accounts must be in good standing before you can play at the Club. Prompt payment will confirm your child's spot.

IMPORTANT INFO:

Dress Code

Players will wear respectable tennis attire while playing at the Royal Oak Tennis Club. Up to 20% of colour is permitted as part of the traditional "tennis whites" dress code. Logos on the tennis attire should be sports-related and kept to a minimum. Footwear must be court appropriate, composed of a flat non-scuffing or marking sole, and is not obligated to be white.

Code of Conduct

While on club property or representing the club elsewhere, have fun, be a good sport and remember......

- 1. Use appropriate language (no swearing or rudeness)
- 2. Speak at a regular volume (no unnecessary shouting)
- 3. Refrain from using obscene gestures or sounds (you know what these are!!)
- 4. Refrain from reckless or dangerous behavior (no fence climbing, no running in the parking lot, be aware of surroundings when swinging or hitting).
- 5. Respect all equipment (no racquet throwing, no damaging of nets or other club equipment).
- 6. Dress in a respectable fashion.
- 7. Clean up after yourself (outside and in the clubhouse).
- 8. Be a good sport on and off the courts (no bullying, no tempers).
- 9. Wait until the point is finished before interrupting court play to speak to parents and friends (except in emergency), accessing another court or retrieving balls that have rolled onto the next court.
- 10. Listen to the club pro and assistants (no talking back, no attitudes)
- 11. Seek the help of the pro, assistant or any adult present, if you have a concern or are having a difficult time dealing with an issue while on club property.



<u>Juniors are expected to abide by club by-laws and court regulations</u> (as they pertain to Juniors). Juniors under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult while at the club – this adult (parent or guardian) is therefore responsible for the child while on the property

Use of the Courts

Juniors are full club members and can certainly play outside of lessons. However, children under 10 must be accompanied by an adult (not to play but supervise) and can only play on upper courts. Children 10 and over can play in the lower courts but must be wearing proper court shoes.

While the general principle is to allow members court time of 1 hour (depending on the court rotation system outlined below,) if courts are available at the completion of time allowed, members may continue to play. We encourage all members to be courteous and civil about the process. The court rotation system is in place to ensure all members get a chance to play and use the courts with the shortest possible wait time in a manner that is fair for all. Rotation times are clearly indicated on the board by the courts. If a member wishes to use a particular court, they can hang a racquet on the appropriate hook on the board by the courts. When the rotation time comes, the court must be immediately made available to the member whose racket is hanging on the hook regardless of the amount of time the occupants of the court have been playing or whether another court with the same or other rotation time is available. Courts must also be made available on time for Round Robins and other scheduled events and clinics.

Social Events

All Children are welcome to attend our Friday night Social Events. Children can invite non-member guests; however, non-members must pay a guest fee of \$20 for those that want to play tennis and \$10 if not playing. To clarify this is over and above whatever the meal charge is. Children under 10 must be accompanied by an adult and the non-member guest fees above apply.
